We have been facilitating Indigenous artist programs for four years with our annual Orange and Pink Shirt Campaigns and have been working to launch a clothing brand to coincide with Indigenous History Month in June of 2022.

Bayja grew up in an artistically talented family that nurtured her creativity, from her father's wood carving to her grandmother's wide variety of artistic talents, including painting, drawing, and music.

Kory Parkin is a Kanyen'kéha (Mohawk) artist who grew up in the small Mohawk Community of Kenhtè:ke (Tyendinaga) Mohawk Territory in Ontario. Kory is grateful for a loving family who has always supported his creativity and continues to be his inspiration, including his new son, Griffin.
